- Move forward with One Project, One Review. Sign Cooperation and Substitution Agreements with all willing provinces, territories, and Indigenous Governing Bodies within six months
- Establish "One Window" project decisions through a Major Federal Project Office
- Render final decisions on projects on a maximum two-year timeline

- Invest in critical minerals
- Secure Canada's energy and electricity sovereignty
- Invest in Northern infrastructure, including a new hydroelectricity project
- Speed up the approval of clean energy projects

- Focus on attracting top global talent
- Revitalize the Global Skills Strategy
- Work with provinces and territories to streamline and speed up recognition of foreign credentials and international professional experience
- Achieve mutual recognition of credentials with provinces and territories

- Conduct a review of the corporate tax system
- Balance the operating budget by Budget 2028
- Ensure federal investment dollars catalyze multiple times their value in private investment
- Advance Canada's six major investment tax credits
- New Al deployment tax credit for SMEs
- Legislate the repeal of the consumer "carbon tax"
- Cancel the hike in the capital gains inclusion rate

- Require all relevant federal departments to undertake reviews and to report on progress, within 60 days, on steps to eliminate outdated or unnecessary rules
- Speed up the approval of clean energy projects
- Expedite project reviews, including for major energy infrastructure

- Connect critical mineral projects to supply chains through a new First and Last Mile Fund

Build out Canada's east-west electricity grid

- New \$5 billion Trade Diversification Corridors Fund
- Extending the Extended Railway Interswitching pilot by three years
- Pursue new trade deals with MERCOSUR and ASEAN



- Repeal Bill C-69
- Bring in "One and Done" approvals and accelerate priority resource projects
- Create a single Rapid Resource Project Office to streamline all regulatory approvals into one application and environmental review
- Scrap the electricity tax

Scrap the fuel regulations

- Repeal the West Coast tanker ban (C-48)
- Repeal the 'No More Development' Law (C-69)
- Fast-track B.C.'s LNG Canada Phase 2 and the GNL Québec LNG project
- Double oil production in Newfoundland and Labrador, and greenlight the LNG NL project

- Keep the rate of population growth below the rate of housing growth, job growth, and health care accessibility
- Rapidly recognize U.S.-board certified healthcare professionals
- Create nationally-recognized licenses for doctors, nurses, early childhood educators, and other professions
- Pass a one-for-one spending law. For every new dollar spent, an equal amount must be reduced
- Ensure that for every \$1 of new administrative burden, \$2 is removed
- Reform Investment Tax Credits
- Scrap the capital gains tax hike
- Scrap the consumer and industrial carbon tax
- Cut spending on consultants to save \$10.5 billion

- Fast-track approvals for transmission lines, railways, pipelines, and other critical infrastructure
- Create "Shovel Ready Zones," which are prepermitted
- Reduce regulations by 25% within two years, and ensure that two regulations are eliminated for every new one

- Create a National Energy Corridor
- Introduce a Free Trade Bonus
- Unlock Arctic ports, approve oil exports from Canada's Arctic ports, and expand the Port of Churchill to extend the shipping season
- Slash exceptions in the Canadian Free Trade Agreement
- Pursue a CANZUK free trade and mobility agreement with the UK, Australia, and New Zealand



No language

- Develop sector-specific industrial strategies for energy, mining, manufacturing, buildings and transportation
- Aim to power Canada with net-zero electricity by 2035, moving to 100% non-emitting electricity by 2045
- Create residencies for qualified, internationally trained doctors already living in Canada
- Implement a pan-Canadian medical licensure
- Eliminate the consumer carbon tax
- Reverse the trend of using external contractors to do work that could be done by the civil service
- Fiscal target of a falling debt-GDP ratio by the fourth year at the latest
- Identify shovel-ready infrastructure projects roads, bridges, transit, community projects and health care capital
- Start work on an East-West clean energy grid
- Increase the federal government's capital investment budget by \$10 billion per year
- Invest in Canada's productive assets, including ports, rail, highways, and Arctic infrastructure
- Work to eliminate inter-provincial trade barriers
- Expand trade relations with countries other than the US
