For every new dollar spent, an equal amount must be reduced</li><li>• Ensure that for every \$1 of new administrative burden, \$2 is removed</li><li>• Reform Investment Tax Credits</li><li>• Scrap the capital gains tax hike</li><li>• Scrap the consumer and industrial carbon tax</li><li>• Cut spending on consultants to save \$10.5 billion</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Fast-track approvals for transmission lines, railways, pipelines, and other critical infrastructure</li><li>• Create “Shovel Ready Zones,” which are pre-permitted</li><li>• Reduce regulations by 25% within two years, and ensure that two regulations are eliminated for every new one</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Create a National Energy Corridor</li><li>• Introduce a Free Trade Bonus</li><li>• Unlock Arctic ports, approve oil exports from Canada’s Arctic ports, and expand the Port of Churchill to extend the shipping season</li><li>• Slash exceptions in the Canadian Free Trade Agreement</li><li>• Pursue a CANZUK free trade and mobility agreement with the UK, Australia, and New Zealand</li></ul>
